

Rostock - the multimodal hub at the Baltic Sea:

- centrally located at the Southern Baltic Sea coast
- serving all Nordic countries
- ideal location to serve different hinterland corridors from one port (south-western, central, south-eastern corridor)





- Ukrainian war with no direct effect on North-South-traffic flows, however, current business models of industrialized countries (like Germany) based on cheap energy and cheap pre-production are endangered
- globalization is making a break – near- or multisourcing instead; security of supply is gaining importance
- highly efficient ultra-short routes and increasing ship dimensions on medium and longer routes: Giant RoRo/RoPax put pressure on ports infrastructure
- environmental challenges will continue and even accelerate, greening of transport chains - Freight growth will be based more and more on intermodal hinterland connections
- shorter (not shortest possible) routes will possibly outperform longer routes when in direct competition
- Hub port concepts will become increasingly important
